**Reflect:** Now that you have a better understanding of "shalom," if someone were to greet you in that way, how might it make you feel, and how might you respond?

Saturday John 20:21

**Reflect:** What would it look like for you to be an agent of Jesus's shalom? Who do you know that needs an experience of shalom? What role can you play in the realization of their shalom experience? **Prayer:** Pray the prayer of St. Francis

Sunday Luke 2:13-14

**Reflect:** Does shalom characterize your daily life? Why or why not? As you think about attending worship today, how will you bring shalom to others? Who might be waiting for you so they can experience some measure of shalom?
